One hundred years after the First World War, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who fought overseas for Australia, are starting to gain recognition. Many soldiers however hid their identity and true age in order to serve in the war - their story has remained untold. As part of their 2013 NAIDOC celebrations, Redland Shire Council created an honour roll to commemorate the indigenous people who fought for the country. Hear from Di Andrews, whose grandfather, Jack Lander, was one of these previously forgotten soldiers.
