He has over twenty years of experience in cyber security, specialising in breach response, digital forensic investigations and the provision of expert evidence in legal proceedings.

His team led the investigation and response for some of Australia's most high-profile cyber breaches, including PageUp People in 2018, LandMark White in 2019, Law In Order in 2020, and several of the breaches referred to by the Prime Minister in his announcement in June 2020.

Nick and his team have also been engaged as experts in hundreds of legal matters, from commercial litigation and electronic discovery to criminal prosecution and defence, financial fraud, corruption, employee misconduct, theft of intellectual property and computer hacking.

He was previously a senior director in a "big four" digital forensic practice and a team leader in the High Tech Crime Team of the Australian Federal Police, where he worked (with Alastair MacGibbon) on international police investigations and intelligence operations, including counter terrorism, online child exploitation, computer hacking, and traditional crimes facilitated by new technologies.

Nick is also a Certified Instructor with the prestigious SANS Institute and teaches advanced digital forensics and incident response to hundreds of students around the world.
